Scott Besley currently serves as the vice chair of the Board and previously served as chair eight years. Before joining the Board he served on the Supervisory Committee. He has completed the entire Volunteer Achievement Program. Scott is Associate Professor in the Finance Department in the USF Muma College of Business (serving as department chair from 1998 until 2015). Dr. Besley also serves on the USF Local Fee Committee, the USF Board of Trustees Finance & Audit Workgroup, the Advisory Board of the Academy of Finance of Hillsborough County, and the Investment Oversight Committee of the Pinellas County School Board. He has been a faculty member at USF since 1982 and a member of the credit union since 1983.



Scott Brophy currently serves as a director for the credit union and began his volunteer work in 2015.
